All school entries except written work are to be delivered to the showground on Thursday 18 October between 3.30pm - 5.00pm **or** on Friday 19 October 2018 (day before the Show) by 9.30am. Written work needs to be delivered as instructed in their sections.

COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS

All exhibits are to be claimed between 10.00am - 11.30am on Sunday 21 October 2018.

(Unless prior arrangements have been made with Secretary.)

PRIZES AND PRIZE MONEY

All Adult 1st Prizes are \$5.00 and 2nd Prizes are \$3.00 unless otherwise stated.
