THE JOAN HUDSON PERPETUAL TROPHIES

Mrs Joan Hudson, who died, aged 92 years in 2019, was a very well-known and respected Longford local. She was the daughter of the local grocer and married the local undertaker. Throughout her life Mrs Hudson was involved in many organisations, both as a businesswoman and a volunteer, of nearly all the local groups, clubs and committees in the area. She gave freely of her time and often gave monetary gifts. In later years she provided a property, rent free, to the Toosey Auxiliary for their Op Shop. Mrs Hudson spent her final years in Toosey Aged and Community Care Home.

Mrs Hudson was a Life Member of the Longford Show Society and for many years was on the Show Committee. She had a special interest in the Home Industries Section, having entered for many years, in all the various classes and also being active on the Home Industries Committee. Frequently, she cooked food, sewed, knitted and crocheted items for the less well-off in the Longford area.

It is in her memory and, from her generous donation to the Show Society, that we are able to provide two Perpetual Shields, one for adults and one for juniors. The successful exhibitors will have their names inscribed upon the Shields, that will remain on display in the Show Office. They will also each be given a small trophy, which they can keep.

The Adult Perpetual Shield is awarded to the entrant who has achieved the highest number of points from within a combination of Home Industries Sections; Preserves Farm Produce, Cooking, Machine Sewing, Embroidery, Knitting and Crochet and Craft and Patchwork. Each item entered will automatically earn one point, with extra points for those awarded 1st or 2nd place. It is not necessary to have entries in each section.

Entrants are encouraged to enter multiple classes within the Sections to demonstrate a variety of skills.

The Junior Perpetual Shield will be awarded to the entrant with the most points from entries in Sections; Junior Cooking, Junior Handcraft and Junior Sewing. Each entry will earn one point, with extra points for those awarded 1st or 2nd place.

1. The preferred method of Entry is by email. Exhibit Tickets will be issued by return email.

If you are unable to print Exhibit Tickets, please include a note with your entry, and add an extra \$1.50 to your Entry Fee, to cover the cost of postage and envelope.

If you are unable to email your entry, please supply a Stamped Self-Addressed envelope with your Entry Form and Exhibit Tickets will be posted to you.
2. Any Exhibit which has previously won a prize, at any Longford Show, will not be eligible for a prize.
3. All Exhibits are to be the bona fide work of the Exhibitor.
4. Work must have been completed within the last two (2) years – Except Class 120.
5. No article is to be entered in more than one (1) class.
6. Exhibits entered in incorrect classes will be moved to the correct Class, at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
7. In all Sections, Exhibit Numbers will be issued, which must be fixed to each item, with a safety pin, sewn on or taped. No straight pins are to be used. Please cover over the Exhibitor's name.
8. All items received after 10.00am on Friday 17 October 2025, will be for exhibition only and will not be judged.
9. All unclaimed exhibits will be disposed of at the discretion of the Home Industries Committee.
10. The Longford Show Society reserves the right to amend the Schedule of Prizes, where a sponsor, withdraws or fails to meet a commitment.
11. The Longford Show Society also reserves the right to substitute prizes in lieu of prize money.
12. Finish and presentation are considered when judging. **THE JUDGES DECISION IS FINAL.** Every care will be taken of Exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by Longford Show Society Inc. for the loss or damage to any exhibit during transit, display or judging.
